Dr. Robert Reich, one of the world's leading thinkers about work and the economy, will provide the Summit's opening keynote address. Now Chancellor's Professor of Public Policy at UC Berkeley, Reich served under three national administrations and was recently named one of the nation's top 10 thought leaders by The Wall Street Journal. Reich leverages innovative teaching methods to reach, engage, and educate an exceptionally large audience of learners. Through his popular Facebook page and founding of Inequality Media, Reich makes discussions, videos, live interviews, lectures, and long-form videos publically available. These videos have been watched by 50+ million people and allow Reich to extend the impact of his

teaching far beyond those that attend his classes.







Dr. Cynthia Teniente-Matson President of Texas A&M San Antonio and former CFO of CSU Fresno, Dr. Arthur Levine President of The Woodrow Wilson Foundation and former President of Teachers College, Columbia University, and Dr. Gaye Theresa Johnson recipient of the 2013 Freedom Now! Award and an expert in race and racism, cultural history, spatial politics, and political economy will participate in a panel discussion aimed at highlighting how higher education

What workshops will be hosted for educators?



Margarita Quihuis, a behavior designer and researcher at the Stanford Persuasive Technology Lab and co-director of the Peace Innovation Lab at Stanford University, will lead a hands-on workshop focused on leveraging cutting edge research on innovation, game design thinking, and persuasive technology to enhance the ways in which educators design curriculum, engage students, and manage the learning experience. Margarita will also utilize behavior science research to teach models and methods in behavior design so educators can think clearly and systematically about how behavior works, how they can approach

behavior change, and how they can use behavior design within and beyond their classroom. In addition to being named 'One of The 100 Most Influential Latinos in Silicon Valley' and receiving the Maestro Award by Latino Leaders Magazine, Margarita is a recognized thought leader in innovation, emergent social behavior, and technology, and has been part of Deloitte's On Social Roundtable and Aspen Institute's Dialogue on Open Innovation and Dialogue on Diplomacy and Technology.



Dr. Chris Emdin, a New York Times bestselling author and Director of Science Education in the Department of Mathematics, Science, and Technology at Teachers College, Columbia University, will lead an interactive workshop focused on replacing outdated approaches to teaching and learning in schools. Chris's workshop will build off his popular TED talk "Teach Teachers How To Create Magic" and will provide educators with innovative tools, methods, and techniques they can use to more effectively engage those in their classroom. His workshop will also allow space for educators to share and discuss questions and challenges connected to

their personal teaching experiences, and will empower educators to engage with and learn from one another in a dynamic setting. Chris also serves as the Associate Director of the Institute For Urban and Minority Education at Teachers College, Columbia University and was named STEM Access Champion of Change by the White House.
